

## Series Points System

ACA Provincial Standings are based on the total score for an athlete.
Table 1 identifies the number of points awarded for each placement at Series and at Provincial competitions. Only ACA members are eligible to earn points at an ACA sanctioned event (Series or Provincials).

## Scoring Ties at an ACA Sanctioned Event

If there is a tie at an event, the points for each placement of the tied competitors are totaled and then divided by the number of competitors who are tied. This average amount is then awarded to each of the tied competitors. See examples below.

## Example 1:

Two athletes tie for 1st at a Local Series event.

Points for 1st (100) + Points for 2 nd ( 80 ) $=180$ total points for the two tied competitors.
180 points $/ 2$ competitors $=90$ points each.

| Placement | Points Awarded |
| :---: | :---: |
| Tied for 1st | 90 |
| Tied for 1st | 90 |
| 3rd place | 60 |

## Example 2:

Four athletes tie for 6th at a Local Series event.
Point for 6 th $(25)+$ points for 7 th $(20)+$ points for 8 th $(15)+$ points for 9 th $(12)=72$ total points for the four tied competitors.

72 points $/ 4$ competitors $=18$ points each.
